Common Prowords

ACKNOWLEDGE An instruction to the receiver that the transmission must be acknowledged.

AFFIRMATIVE

ALL AFTER Reference all of a transmission after the word or phrase given. ALL BEFORE Reference all of a transmission before the word or phrase given.

I have higher priority traffic. (Used with care) **BREAK**

Correct **CHARLIE**

CLEAR Done using this frequency.

What you have transmitted is correct. CORRECT

CORRECTION I have made an error and the correct information follows.

Numerals or numbers follow. **FIGURES**

INITIALS Letter or letters follow.

I SAY AGAIN I repeat my last transmission.

I SPELL The next word will be spelled out phonetically.

INTERROGATIVE Ouestion.

NEGATIVE No

OUT This is the end of the transmission, no reply is expected. **OVER** This is the end of my transmission at this time, your reply is necessary.

I have received your transmission satisfactorily. ROGER

SAY AGAIN Repeat the last transmission.

SYMBOL FOR Used primarily for punctuation, as in SYMBOL FOR Comma.

This transmission is from the station whose call sign immediately follows. THIS IS That which immediately follows is the date-time group of the message. TIME

WAIT I must pause for a few seconds.

WAIT, OUT I must pause longer than a few seconds and will recontact you by call sign. I have received your signal, understand it, and will comply. (Since the meaning WILCO

of ROGER is included in that of WILCO, the two prowords are never used

together.)

Designates the word after...as SAY AGAIN WORD AFTER. WORD AFTER WRONG My last transmission was incorrect, correct transmission follows.
